## Welcome

Stationers' Hall is located at the top of Ludgate Hill, off Ave Maria Lane, just opposite St Paul's Cathedral. Whether you are visiting for a tour or attending an event we guarantee stress free access.

We are fully accessible for wheelchair users and can cater for anyone with other specific access requirements.

## At a Glance

### Level Access

- There is level access from the garden entrance to:
  - Garden
  - Court Room
  - Main Hall
  - Toilets
  - Third Floor meeting Room

### Hearing

- We have a hearing loop in both our Court Room and Main Hall when wearing a hearing aid please move to the 'T' position.

## Travel by public transport

- From St Paul's underground station (Central Line)

Exit the station using the right-hand exit

Turn left (back on yourself) and walk-through Paternoster Square

(St Paul's Cathedral will be on your left and The Happenstance bar on your right)

Keep walking through the square down Paternoster Lane

You will pass a large steel sculpture on your left

Cross over the road (Ave Maria Lane) and the entrance to our Courtyard is right in front of you

- From Blackfriars station (District & Circle)

Exit onto Queen Victoria Street and turn right onto New Bridge Street (towards Holborn)

Continue to Ludgate Circus (large crossroads)

Turn right onto Ludgate Hill with St Paul's Cathedral ahead of you

On the left hand side you will see Cards Galore and Cote Brasserie

Between them is an alleyway - Stationers' Hall Court

This leads you into our Courtyard. Enter the Hall via the stone stairs straight ahead of you.

- From Bank station (Waterloo & City, Northern, Central, DLR)

Exit onto Cheapside, towards St Paul's Cathedral

Continue along Cheapside until you get to St Paul's tube

Follow above directions from St Paul's tube station

## Travel by taxi

- You can get a taxi with Licensed London Taxi by calling (0) 7519 055 741. The taxi company has a wheelchair accessible vehicle.

## Parking

- There is a drop-off point at the main entrance. The drop-off point has a dropped kerb.
- There are a few parking spaces for disabled users that need to be booked in advanced with the Hall Manager who can be contacted on 020 7246 0998
- The nearest NCP car park on Aldersgate Street, 158-170 Aldersgate Street, London, EC1A 4HY has 670 bays and 6 disabled bays

## Arrival

### Path to main entrance

- From the street to the main entrance, there is level access.
- Disabled access is through the courtyard into the garden gate

### Main entrance

- The main entrance has one flight of stairs but has handrails on either side

## Getting around inside

### Lift

- We have a main lift at the garden entrance with a second lift available to access the cloakroom.

## Public toilet

### Unisex Accessible Toilet

- There are two public toilets for disabled visitors.
- The toilets are located at the garden entrance and the second floor. The toilet door is 800mm wide.
- There is 780mm in front of the toilet. The toilet seat is 480mm high.
- There are horizontal grab rails located to the left of the toilet.
  
- There are baby changing facilities within this toilet located on the second floor

## Customer care support

### Emergency evacuation procedures

- We have emergency evacuation procedures for disabled visitors.
- In the case of an evacuation, all customers inside will be led to safety by a member of the team
